

Daniella is currently employed at the Public Health Agency of Canada with the Canadian Integrated Program for Antimicrobial Resistance Surveillance (CIPARS) acting as lead of the program conducting surveillance on antimicrobial use and resistance and associated research projects related to dairy cattle. She obtained her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the Ontario Veterinary College in 2017, a Master of Public Health from the University of Guelph in 2020 and is currently working on a PhD in epidemiology with a focus on antimicrobial use in dairy cattle. She has been working as a dairy veterinarian at a large dairy-focused practice in Southwestern Ontario in both full and part-time capacities since she graduated from veterinary school in 2017.
